BRIEF SUMMARIES OF STUDIES EVALUATED AS PART OF THE VAN MAELE-FABRY (2010) REVIEW THAT DID NOT FULFILL THE SELECTION CRITERIA OF THE COC EVALUATION

Abadi-Korek (2006)	Exposure was not clearly identified as para-occupational, and exposure to pesticides was included with other exposures such as to wood and sawdust
Ali (2004)	Similar to Abadi-Korek (2006) where exposure is based on job classification, including wood treaters
Gardner (1990), Hemminki (1981), Laval and Tuyns (1988), Lowengart (1987), Magnani (1990), Roman (1993), Shu (1988), and Van Steensel-Moll (1985)	Published pre-1996
Heacock (2000)	Both papers related to organochlorines
Infante-Rivard (1991)	Maternal occupational exposure during pregnancy
Infante-Rivard (1999)	Paternal occupational exposure for 2 years prior to pregnancy
McKinney (2003)	Maternal occupational exposure for 1 year before birth of the child (peri-conception)
Menegaux (2006) and Rudant (2007)	Household pesticide used by either or both parents, which is direct 'occupational' use of pesticides
Pearce (2006)	Based on father's job description for exposure, at the time of birth of the child. This was not para-occupational exposure of the child. The classification of the father's occupation on the birth certificate was used as an indicator of paternal exposure so there was no actual exposure information
Perez-Saldivar (2008)	Paper related mainly to methods
Rodvall (2003)	Reported on cancer incidence in offspring of male pesticide applicators in Sweden. There was no indication of how/whether para-occupational exposure had occurred
